Visit Winterbourne House and the Barber Institute of Fine Art

Thursday 4th May 2023

Spend a day in Edgbaston, based at the Arts and Crafts inspired Winterbourne House and Garden. After lunch there (included), take an afternoon stroll to the Barber Institute of Fine Art and its internationally renowned collections of paintings, drawings, sculpture and coins.

Winterbourne House and Garden

This Arts and Crafts House was built for the Nettleford Family in 1904. The seven-acre garden was designed by Margaret Nettlefold, influenced by Gertrude Jekyll. In 1925 the house and garden was bought by John Nicolson, another passionate gardener, who in 1944 bequeathed the whole estate to the University of Birmingham, restored and opened to the public in 2010. The garden is now the University's Botanic Garden, with original features retained, including the planting, the walled garden and glasshouses, a pleached lime walk, a Japanese bridge and tea house, sunken rock garden and woodland walk. The garden houses the national collection of *Anthemis*. A permanent exhibition tells the history of the garden. There is access from the garden to Edgbaston Pool, a lake and woodland, designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest.

The Barber Institute of Fine Art

A gentle six minute stroll from Winterbourne House, the Barber Institute was founded in 1932 by Martha Constance Hattie Barber and her husband 'for the study and encouragement of art and music'. The Grade 2 listed Art Deco style building in which it is housed opened in 1939. The Institute is now home to the departments of Music and History of Art of the University of Birmingham, and, in its four galleries, holds what has been described as the finest small European art collection in the UK. This includes seven centuries of painting from Botticelli and Bellini, through Rubens, Gainsborough, Gauguin, Monet, Manet and Van Gogh to Magritte and Frank Auerbach. There are sculptures by Rodin and Degas, collections of prints and drawings, examples of the decorative arts, and a coin gallery.

A guided tour of Winterbourne House Garden can be booked in advance as an optional extra at £6 per person. Please see the Booking Form and, if you choose this, include the cost in your payment.

Itinerary

Arrival at Winterbourne House by **10.45am**. Entry is included. You are free to explore the house and gardens in your own time, but a guided tour of the garden by expert volunteers (£6) is recommended. Lunch of a sandwich, scone, preserves and cream, with tea or coffee, is included. After lunch, walk over to the Barber Institute, only six-minutes away. Visit the galleries when you choose, and stay as long as you wish. The coach will pick us up from Winterbourne House at **4.30pm** return to Bristol by **6.30pm**.
